Biography

Bruce A. Hidley was born and raised in Albany, New York. Bruce graduated from Cardinal McCloskey High School, and then attended Hudson Valley Community College, earning an A.A.S. Degree in Criminal Justice in 1979. Bruce worked as an Auditor for the New York State Comptroller's Office for 11 years, and as the City Clerk for the City of Watervliet for over 22 years. Bruce was elected Albany County Clerk in 2013, reelected in 2017 and currently serves in that position.

Bruce joined the Guilderland Elks Lodge No. 2480 in 1980. In September of 1985, Bruce transferred his membership to Watervliet Lodge No. 1500 and served as Chaplain, Lecturing Knight, Loyal Knight, Leading Knight and then proudly served as the 65th Exalted Ruler from 1991-1992. Following that, Bruce was a Lodge Trustee from 1993-1997 where he served as the Chairman of the Board from 1996-1997. In 2002, Bruce served as the President of the State Capital District's Past Exalted Ruler Association. Bruce remains a very active Member serving on many Lodge committees.

On the State level, in 1996, Bruce was appointed to be the Director on the Conference of Private Organization (CONPOR) serving as Vice President and President. From 1997- 2007, Bruce was honored to serve as the New York State Elks Association Government Relations Chairman. In 2000, Bruce was appointed as a member of the Steering Committee for Amsterdam Lodge No. 101. Bruce served as the New York State Elks Association President in 2007-2008. He then served as the Area 1 Government Relations Chairman from 2011-2017.

On the Grand Lodge level, Bruce served as District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler in 2001-2002. He was installed to the Board of Grand Trustees from 2018-2022. He served as Buildings Applications East Member, Home Member, Approving Member and Vice Chairman.

Bruce is also active with many community activities that include The Ancient Order of Hibernians, Albany County Board of the Ancient Order of Hibernians, Knights of Columbus No. 3394, North Albany Limericks, Board of Directors Watervliet Civic Chest, Watervliet Senior Citizens and as a social member of the C.R.A.B. VFW Post.

Bruce and Helen reside in Watervliet, New York. They enjoy camping in the Adirondacks and spending time with their numerous nieces, nephews, grand-nieces, and grand-nephews. They will be celebrating 40 wonderful years of marriage.


FLAG RETIREMENT BOX

As you probably are aware, your ENVSC VA Representative visits to facilities have been all but stopped due to the COVID-19 pandemic. BUT, in true Elks style, we continue to serve. During the Pandemic many veterans in VA facilities experienced additional trauma due to isolation and loneliness. During the pandemic your ENVSC Representatives transitioned from personal visits to shipping items to the facility or dropping them off at the door. The Silver Lining? ENVSC continued to provide funding for these facilities during shutdown. This gave

our ENVSC Representatives the opportunity to purchase bigger ticket items to help address the isolation and limit contact with family and friends, we purchase laptops and tablets and subscriptions to Zoom which provided the veterans the ability to Facetime with family and talk with friends on Zoom meetings.

Amid all the challenges the 2020-21 Elk year presented, KY ENVSC Representatives provided **1,588.5 Volunteer Hours**, along with **\$14,558.81** in funding and requested items and **served 2,225 veterans** in VA Facilities. Great Job ENVSC Reps. You make us proud!

In addition to monthly funding, KY ENVSC Representative received BOOST grants to support additional support:

Brian Kinney, Cynthiana Lodge # 217, supporting the Lexington VA, Cooper Division received \$994.56 in Boost Grant funding to provide clothing kits for veterans who visit the hospital. Kits included sweatpants and shirts and are distributed at the guidance the VA coordinator. Brian recently made the Elks.org veterans homepage for being the first ENVSC representative in the nation to return to the facility and will soon be inducted into the KY Elks Veterans Hall of Fame. Congratulations Brian.

Tom Armstrong, Lyndon Lodge # 2052, supporting the Robley Rex VA Hospital in Louisville received \$1,000.00 in Boost Grant Funding to support the purchase of personal toiletries for patients in the hospital. Items included shampoo, soap, dental floss, denture adhesive, combs and more.

Martin Harbolt, Louisville Lodge # 8, supporting the Radcliff Veterans Center in Fort Knox, KY, received a \$1,000.00 Boost Grant to provide Memory & Mental Stimulation for Alzheimer's & Dementia –Large Lock Station Center,

Various Music Recordings, MEROCO Montessori Matching Colorful Keys and Locks Set and Montessori Practical Life Matching Game. Each of these items assist the residents with memory care and dementia treatments and in some cases comfort care during end of life services.

We hope all facilities will be open soon so we can return to having personal visits with residents in the facilities. On top of the Boost Grants, 9 local lodges were selected to receive one of the 325 available Freedom Grants to assist veterans in their local communities:

It's never too early to plan your Lodge's Red Ribbon Celebration for the month of October. There are many ways to celebrate Red Ribbon Week (October 23-31) and every part of your community can get involved.

Here's 10 easy tips for your Lodge to have a successful program.

- 1. Contact your elected officials about issuing a proclamation declaring Red Ribbon Week in your community. You can obtain PDF copies of proclamations from your State Chair.
- 2. Invite elected and government officials to participate in Red Ribbon Week activities.
- 3. Display a basket of red ribbons in the reception area of your Lodge for visitors and Members to take, along with copies of the Red Ribbon Week fact card, which are available from your State Chair.
- 4. Display red ribbons on the interior and exterior surfaces of your Lodge's building.
- 5. Sponsor a special drug abuse prevention seminar for the community. Invite a speaker who is an expert on drug prevention and invite the community to attend.
- 6. Submit a public service announcement about Red Ribbon Week activities to your local radio station. These can be found in the DAP section of the Elks webpage.
- 7. Sponsor an in-service educational program for your Members and community leaders.
- 8. Organize a drug prevention awareness fair. Invite local nonprofit organizations to participate by staffing exhibit booths, distributing educational materials, offering free health screenings, and much more. The Elks are leaders in this area and your Lodge will stand out!
- 9. Set up and staff an exhibit table at a local hospital, doctor's office, community center, or shopping center to promote Red Ribbon Week and to distribute drug prevention information and materials.
- 10. Post fact sheets and Red Ribbon Week event notices and other materials on community webpages, and on bulletin boards in libraries, hospitals, local churches, synagogues, gymnasiums, grocery stores, parks and recreation departments, health clinics, universities, and other public places.

Some of these ideas take little effort, while others take more of a commitment. What are you waiting for?
